Todd Miller, MD, FAAFP chosen as national recipient of Exemplary Teaching Award winner

LEAWOOD, KANSAS – **Todd Miller, MD, FAAFP** of Wichita, Kansas has been selected by the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) Board of Directors as the recipient of the AAFP's 2018 Exemplary Teaching Award in the volunteer category. The award was developed to acknowledge exemplary teaching skills, as well as individuals who have implemented outstanding educational program implementation and/or innovative teaching models. Dr. Miller was honored as the Kansas Exemplary Teaching Award recipient in the volunteer category at Kansas Academy of Family Physicians (KAFP) Annual Meeting on June 15, 2018 and nominated for the national award. He will be recognized during the AAFP Congress of Delegates in New Orleans in October.

In his letter to Dr. Miller, AAFP President, Michael Munger, MD, FAAFP (Overland Park, Kansas) writes: "In your 30-plus years of teaching medical students in your office practice, you have built a reputation as an outstanding family physician role model who goes above and beyond what is expected of a clinical preceptors. You ensure that your students' time with you is valuable providing a supportive environment and exposure to interesting, challenging cases. Your colleagues and medical students laud your extensive clinical knowledge, as well as your unwavering devotion to your patients and your compassionate approach to their care. One of your former students particularly remembers your emphasis on prevention and wellness, noting that she thinks of you whenever she asks patients who present with simple cold symptoms about their smoking status. Throughout your long time service to the Kansas Academy of Family Physicians you have demonstrated the competence, reliability, and trustworthiness that your students respect and admire. Your willingness to make time in your already full clinical schedule to teach medical students clearly shows your dedication to shaping the next generation of family physicians. The Board comments you for your excellence as a family physician and educator."



Dr. Miller was born and raised in Great Bend, Kansas. He received his undergraduate degree from Fort Hays State University, Hays, Kansas. Dr. Miller earned his medical degree from the University of Kansas School of Medicine and completed his family medicine residency at St. Joseph Medical Center, Wichita. He practiced in Atchison, Kansas from 1984-1987 before joining West Wichita Family Physicians where he has practiced for the last 31 years. Dr. Miller is a Clinical Assistant Professor in the Department of Family and Community Medicine at the University of Kansas School of Medicine – Wichita.
