## Kansas Family Physicians Focus on Saving Patients, Not Profiting from Their Deaths

Family physicians take Hippocratic Oath which promises to "first, do no harm."

KAFP President Chad Johanning, MD, FAAFP of Lawrence, said Monday, "As a family physician serving on the front lines and fighting the effects of COVID-19 across our Kansas communities with my healthcare colleagues, I'm disheartened to have to again defend the work that we are doing."

"Now is not the time to place blame for this complicated pandemic, much less on professionals who have worked tirelessly to save the lives of our patients since the pandemic began nearly eight months ago. As family physicians, our goal is to keep COVID-19 numbers down in our communities, mitigate the risk of community spread, treat patients who do contract the virus, and do everything in our power to keep them out of the hospital and prevent their possible death. To suggest otherwise in this latest claim that doctors are capitalizing off the pandemic is not only unfounded, but also insulting to Kansas family physicians and all physicians alike. Such claims only embolden the harmful and unhelpful belief that science isn't to be trusted." he added.
