Don't forget the Great American Smokeout is Thursday, Nov. 19. Encourage your patients to start their journey toward a smoke-free life! Please take eight minutes of your time to complete this important Behavioral Health Tobacco Project survey led by National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) Kansas with support from the Kansas Health Foundation. The focus of the <u>project</u> is to reduce tobacco use by individuals with behavioral health conditions.

This survey is designed to collect essential information about the capacity of health care professionals to provide evidence-based tobacco dependence treatment. The survey responses will be used to publish a directory of providers for those who wish to be included. The Kansas Tobacco Quitline, KanCare MCOs, and other entities may use the directory to provide referrals for tobacco treatment. We would appreciate your participating in the survey regardless of your level of tobacco treatment services and/or desire to be included in the directory.
