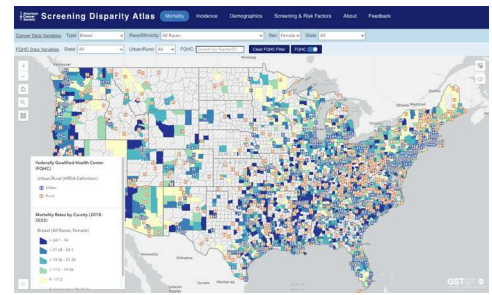
- Estimated numbers of new cancer cases and deaths in 2025 by cancer site and US state

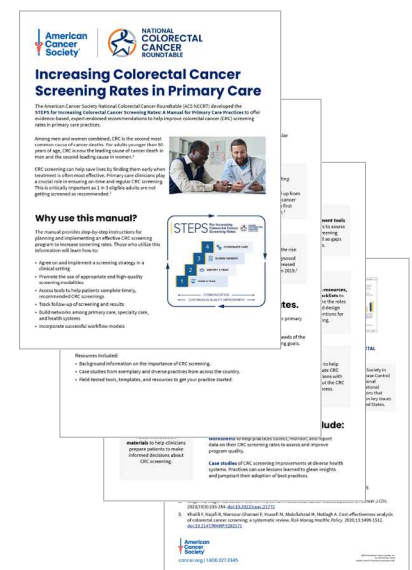
